## ASAMI WINS FUKUSHIMA SPEECH CONTEST

*"Where are you from? Are you Chinese or Korean?" A Canadian high school student asked me this when I was abroad studying English last fall. There was no appropriate answer for this question because I am Japanese! When I answered that I was Japanese he looked very surprised. Perhaps many Japanese can't distinguish Americans from Canadians by appearance, and he couldn't distinguish Japanese from Chinese or Korean people. Yet I felt somewhat shocked by his question. This is because I felt confident that I could never be taken for anything other than Japanese. And above all, I realized that I held some prejudice against the Chinese.*

Keep studying so you'll go even further! Well done to Yoko Inada (3-1), who was able to pass the Pre-1 level. Several first and second year students have also been able to pass high levels as well. After studying French for only eight months, Miku Mizoguchi (3-1) was able to pass the level 4 French Achievement Test. The results of GTEC have been very positive. The listening in third year and writing in all grade levels were especially good. However, the scores in reading in all grade levels were still too low. We need to work on reading more and increasing our vocabulary. The scores in brackets below the third year scores are the all-Japan averages for third year. We hope the first and second year students will continue to study hard to get even better results than the current third year students.
